1. What do you enjoy most about your job?

Liberty University School of Law is a law school committed to academic and professional excellence in the context of the Christian intellectual tradition. 3. Is there any advice you would give pre-law advisors as they are working with students on the application process for your law school?

While considering such predictors of law school success as prior academic performance and LSAT scores, the law school also values evidence of a calling to law and a desire to learn law from the perspective of the Christian worldview. An important component of your application is the personal profile statement. Letters of recommendation receive the close attention of the faculty Admissions Committee. Candidate-evaluation "questionnaires" will also be considered. Successful applicants for admission, in addition to strong academic records, may distinguish themselves in a number of ways, including: time spent away from formal education while engaged in meaningful work, community service or military duty, a rising trend in academic performance versus solid but unexceptional work, employment while in school in response to financial pressures or other needs which demonstrates personal responsibility, significant personal achievement in extracurricular activities which demonstrates leadership potential and a concern for others, unusual experiences or training that promise to bring something different to the community, and an appreciation for traditions in the legal field. The Admissions Committee reviews every file and interviews most applicants.

4. What are some of the unique opportunities students will find at your law school?

At Liberty University School of Law we believe that a quality legal education can only be achieved when traditional, substantive courses of law are integrated with a complete lawyering skills curriculum and a solid grounding in the foundations of law within a Christian worldview. We want to prepare our graduates to be able to perform the tasks required of lawyers every day. The Liberty Law program of comprehensive, yet practical, lawyering skills consists of two threads woven throughout the three-year law school experience. Law students at Liberty also are required to develop a high level of communications skills, learning how to write clearly and speak persuasively. Analytical and problem-solving skills are honed in the context of litigation and dispute resolution, and by learning how to help clients achieve future goals through planning.
